

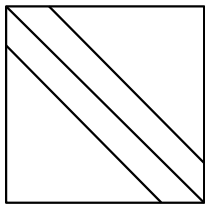
School Girl's Puzzle

Focuses on half square triangles- Finishes 9", unfinished 9½"



- Background: Cut three 3¼" squares
 Cut two 3 1/8" squares, cut once diagonally
 Cut four 2¾" squares
- Green: Cut three 3¼" squares
 Red: cut one 5 3/8 square, cut once diagonally

Half square triangles



Pair the background and green 3¼" squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line and sew ¼" seam on each side of the diagonal line, cut on the diagonal line, press each half square's seam toward the green. Trim each half square to 2¾".

*Useful tools: Clearly Perfect Angles clingy, Bloc-Lock ruler

Make two blocks like this:



Pair half square blocks with background 2¾" squares as pictured. Press seam to the square. When sewing two units together to make this block, press the final seam toward the square. You will need to make a snip on each side in order to get the mini 4 patch. Helps seams lay flat. Unit should measure 5" square. Repeat to make two units.



Make two blocks like this:



1. Layout background triangles (3 1/8" squares, cut once diagonally) to the half square as shown.

2. sew together
 Press seams toward the triangle.
 (Look at upper half of this picture)



3. Sew this new triangle unit right sides together with the red triangle (cut diagonally once from the 5 3/8 square). Your square should now measure 5". Repeat to make a total of two units.



Layout your four 5" units to make your School Girl's Puzzle as pictured on the right. Your block should measure 9½" unfinished
